NEW BEGINNINGS COMMUNITY



Based on the last Point-in-Time Census of homeless persons in Northwest Arkansas¹, more than 15% were living outside in places unfit for human habitation.

At present, there are a limited set of options available to homeless persons finding a pathway out of their unsheltered living conditions into temporary/transitional housing.

With affordable housing shrinking and a 95% occupancy rate in NWA, the proposed transitional shelter community fills an important "shelter/housing first" gap by meeting the crisis-level housing needs for unsheltered homeless persons.

New Beginnings, while providing rapid-around services for its clients, stability, security and engaging other service providers around the area to collaborate in the housing solution, looks to develop an important bridging element to the continuum of care that can move persons out of unsheltered living and set them on a pathway toward more permanent, stable housing.






New Beginnings Phase One: Cabins








New Beginnings Phase Two: Fences + Boardwalk










New Beginnings Longitudinal Site Elevation















New Beginnings Transverse Site Elevation








